

# October 2006 Federal Candidate Survey

In anticipation of the General Election on Tuesday, November 7, Oklahomans For Life/National Right to Life asked the twelve questions below of candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives. The initial after a candidate's name represents party affiliation (Republican, Democrat, or Independent). On the first eleven questions, a "yes" answer indicates agreement with the position of Oklahomans For Life. On question 12, the answer "A," "B," or "C" is shown, as indicated by the candidate.

1) In its 1973 rulings in *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*, the U.S. Supreme Court created a "right to abortion" for any reason until "viability" and for any "health" reasons – including "emotional" health – even during the final three months of pregnancy. Do you support the reversal of the *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton* decisions, thereby allowing the state legislatures and Congress to once again protect unborn children?

2) The right to life of human beings must be respected at every stage of their biological development. Human individuals who are at the embryonic stage of development should not be used for harmful or lethal medical experimentation. This applies equally to human beings whether their lives were begun by *in vitro* fertilization, by somatic cell nuclear transfer (human cloning), or by some other laboratory technique. We oppose harvesting "stem cells" from living human embryos, since this kills the embryos. (We are NOT opposed to other research on stem cells that are obtained without killing embryos, e.g., stem cells from umbilical cord blood and adult tissue.) Will you vote for measures to protect living human embryos from being used for medical experiments that would harm or kill them, including so-called embryonic stem cell research that would require the killing of human embryos, regardless of the method used to create these human embryos?

3) Human cloning (somatic cell nuclear transfer) is a process in which genetic material from one person is artificially transferred into a human or animal egg cell, thereby beginning the life of a new human individual who has only one parent and who is genetically nearly identical to that parent. We believe human life at every stage of biological development is deserving of respect and protection regardless of the circumstances under which that human life was created. It has been proposed to create human life through cloning for the purpose of destructive experiments on those humans, resulting in their deaths, a process sometimes referred to as "therapeutic cloning." Would you support a legal prohibition on all human cloning, including the creation of human embryos by cloning?

4) Using cloned mammals, researchers are developing techniques for "fetus farming" – creating a cloned embryo of a given species, implanting that cloned embryo into the uterus of an adult female of that same species, allowing the cloned animal to grow into various stages of fetal development, and then aborting the fetus in order to harvest the desired tissues or organs. In one study published in 2005, researchers reported implanting cow clones and then aborting the cow fetuses at four months into pregnancy, in order to harvest their liver tissue; this was reported as an advance for "therapeutic cloning." Would you support federal legislation that would prevent "fetus farming" in humans, by prohibiting establishing a human pregnancy for any purpose other than intending a live birth?

5) Would you vote for the current Hyde Amendment policy (restricting federal Medicaid funding of abortions) without weakening amendments?

6) Would you vote against any attempt to weaken or overturn the Mexico City Policy, under which, in order to be eligible for U.S. population-control funds, a private overseas organization must agree not to perform abortions (except to save the life of the mother, or in cases of rape or incest) or to "actively promote abortion as a method of family planning"?

7) Would you vote for the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act (which prohibits the circumventing of state parental-notification or consent laws by making it a federal offense to transport a minor across state lines for a secret abortion) and would you oppose weakening amendments?

8) Title X ("Title 10") of the Public Health Service Act provides about \$286 million annually for grants to state and private entities for "family planning" programs. Although federal law does not permit such funds to be used for abortions, large amounts of Title X funds go to organizations (such as Planned Parenthood) that operate abortion clinics. Would you support legislation to make organizations that operate abortion clinics (not bona fide hospitals) ineligible for Title X funding?

9) Across the nation, pro-abortion officials and advocacy groups have sought to use the compulsory powers of government to compel health-care providers to participate in abortion. The Abortion Non-Discrimination Act would prohibit state and local governments from discriminating against any health care professional, hospital, HMO, insurance plan, or other "health care entity" because of that provider's decision not to perform, cover, or pay for induced abortions. Would you vote for the Abortion Non-Discrimination Act and oppose weakening amendments?

10) A significant number of hospitals have implemented formal policies authorizing denial of lifesaving medical treatment against the will of a patient or the patient's family if an ethics committee thinks the patient's quality of life is unacceptable, even though the patient and family disagree. The federal Patient Self-Determination Act currently requires health care facilities receiving Medicare or Medicaid to ask patients on admission whether they have an advance directive indicating their desire to receive or refuse life-saving treatment under certain circumstances. Would you support preventing involuntary denial of lifesaving medical treatment by amending the Patient Self-Determination Act to provide that if failure to comply with a patient's or surrogate's choice for life-saving treatment would in reasonable medical judgment be likely to result in the patient's death, a health care provider unwilling to respect the choice for life-saving treatment must allow the patient to be transferred to a willing provider and must provide the treatment pending transfer?

11) In 2003 Congress enacted a Medicare law providing for a prescription drug benefit and significantly restructuring Medicare. Of greatest importance to the pro-life movement, the current law permits older Americans to add their own funds, if they wish, on top of the government contribution in order to obtain health insurance that is less likely to ration medical treatment and prescription drugs, and does not impose price controls on premiums for such insurance. Will you vote against any bill that imposes price controls or otherwise limits the right of older Americans who choose to do so to add their own funds on top of the government contribution in order to obtain Medicare health insurance that is less likely to ration medical treatment and prescription drugs?

12) The National Right to Life Committee (NRLC) believes that unborn children should be protected by law, and that abortion should be permitted only when necessary to prevent the death of the mother. Under what circumstances, if any, do you believe that abortion should be legal?  
A – Only to prevent the death of the mother (the NRLC position).  
B – To prevent the mother's death, in cases of incest, and in reported cases of forcible rape.  
C – Other

# State Candidate Survey

In anticipation of the General Election on Tuesday, November 7, Oklahomans For Life asked the twelve questions below of candidates in Oklahoma Statewide races and in races for the Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma State House of Representatives. The most important question is No. 1, and the candidate's answer to that question is written in capital letters. (We asked Statewide candidates, who could not literally "vote for" these measures, to indicate whether they "support" them.) For House and Senate races, the counties or partial counties (marked by an asterisk) in the district are indicated after the district number. The initial after a candidate's name represents party affiliation (Republican, Democrat, or Independent). On each question, a "yes" answer indicates agreement with the position of Oklahomans For Life.

- 1) Upon reversal of the U.S. Supreme Court's *Roe v. Wade* decision, will you vote for a law that would protect the lives of unborn children and prohibit abortion except to prevent the death of the mother?
- 2) If efforts to enact such a law failed, would you vote for a law that would prohibit abortion except where necessary to prevent the death of the mother, or when the pregnancy is the result of forcible rape (reported to a law enforcement agency within seven days), or when the pregnancy of a minor is the result of incest (with the perpetrator of the crime reported to a law enforcement agency)?
- 3) Would you support reporting of abortion complications to measure how "safe" abortion really is?
- 4) Oklahoma has a law providing for notification and consent of a parent before an abortion may be performed on a minor. Would you support strengthening this law and oppose efforts to weaken it?
- 5) Oklahoma has a woman's-right-to-know law providing for informed consent before an abortion. Would you support strengthening this law and oppose efforts to weaken it?
- 6) The right to life of human beings must be respected at every stage of their biological development. Nevertheless, some have proposed taking living human embryos from *in vitro* fertilization clinics and harvesting their stem cells, thereby killing these embryonic human beings. While we support research on stem cells obtained without killing human embryos – e.g. stem cells harvested from umbilical-cord blood or from adult tissue – we oppose killing embryonic human beings. Would you vote for a law to protect living human embryos from being used for medical experiments that harm or kill them, including so-called "embryonic stem-cell research" that would require the killing of human embryos?
- 7) Some researchers have proposed creating human life through cloning, a process wherein genetic material would be artificially transferred into an egg cell from which the nuclear material has been removed, thereby beginning the life of a new human individual. Cloning is being promoted in order to perform destructive experiments on embryonic human beings, which would cause their deaths, or to scavenge cloned humans' bodies for cells, tissue, and organs, resulting in their deaths. Would you vote for a law to prohibit all use of cloning to create any human beings, including human embryos?
- 8) Would you oppose the establishing or funding of school-based "health" clinics, unless they are explicitly prohibited from doing abortion counseling or making abortion referrals or referring students to any other entity which counsels for, refers for, or performs abortions?
- 9) There is currently an aggressive drive underway to legalize euthanasia and assisted suicide across the United States. Causing the starvation or dehydration deaths of persons with disabilities and of incompetent patients who are deemed to be a burden on others or to have a diminished "quality of life" is the euthanasia movement's interim goal while they seek eventual public acceptance of killing by lethal injection or by lethal overdose of controlled substances/dangerous drugs. Oklahoma's Hydration and Nutrition for Incompetent Patients Act protects incompetent persons who have not directed that they be deprived of food and water so they will not be victims of death by starvation or dehydration. Will you oppose any attempt to repeal or weaken this protective law?
- 10) Oklahoma law protects against the involuntary denial of life-saving medical treatment by requiring that if a health-care provider's refusal to

comply with a decision made by or on behalf of a patient to receive life-saving medical treatment would, in reasonable medical judgment, be likely to result in the patient's death, then the health-care provider must provide the life-saving treatment pending transfer of the patient to a willing provider. Will you oppose any attempt to repeal or weaken this protective law?

11) Would you oppose the legalization of lethal prescriptions or lethal injections to intentionally kill an innocent person or to "assist" someone in committing suicide ("active euthanasia")?

12) Oklahoma's advance directive (living will) law recognizes the particular importance of food and water. In order to ensure truly informed consent, our law requires a separately-initialed paragraph in an advance directive in order for artificial administration of food and water to be rejected. Some proposals have been made that would, instead, combine food and water with "medical treatment" like respirators or surgery, so that choosing to forego life-sustaining medical treatment would be assumed to mean the individual wanted to die by starvation and dehydration. In order to avoid confusion and protect individuals who expect to die from their underlying illness or injury, not from starvation or dehydration, will you vote against any bill that would repeal or weaken the existing requirement for a separately-initialed provision in an advance directive to indicate the rejection of food and water?
